Saddleback is a big mountain nestled in Maine's Rangeley Lakes Region. With an elevation of 4,120 feet and a vertical drop of 2,000 feet, Saddleback is able to offer 66 trails and glades for all abilities. The combination of spectacular high alpine beauty, classic New England trails with character and un-crowded charm are the ingredients that make Saddleback different. This year, Saddleback has cut the East's largest glade named Casablanca, which offers 44 acres of exciting tree skiing. The new glade, expanded snowmaking and new fleet of grooming equipment all contribute to a better on-mountain experience and demonstrate that Saddleback is on the move!
