

Mountain Misbehavior

Vehicle rolls over, avoids bear

WESTERN MOUNTAINS — Following are summaries of some of the local law enforcement agencies' and emergency services' activities last week.

Carrabassett Valley Police

Carrabassett Valley's Police Chief Scott Nichols said that his department had 265 requests for service during the month of October.
