MAINE WASTE DISCHARGE APPLICATION

Please take notice that, pursuant to 38 MRSA, Sections 413 and 414-A, Peter Plog of Madrid Twp. Intends to file a wastewater discharge license application with the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP). The application is for the discharge of 315 gallons of secondary treated sanitary wastewater to the Valley Brook in Strong, Maine. The application will be filed on or about Jan. 29, 2010 and will be available for public inspection at DEP's Augusta office during normal business. A copy may also be seen at the municipal offices in Strong, Maine.

A request for a public hearing or a request that the Board of Environmental Protection assume jurisdiction over this application must be received by the DEP in writing, no later than 20 days after the application is found acceptable for processing, or 30 days from the date of this notice, whichever is longer. Requests shall state the nature of the issue(s) to be raised. Unless otherwise provided by law, a hearing is discretionary and may be held if the Commissioner of the Board finds significant public interest or there is conflicting technical information. Public comment will be accepted until a final administrative action is taken to approve, approve with conditions or deny this application. Written public comments or requests for information may be made to the address below.
